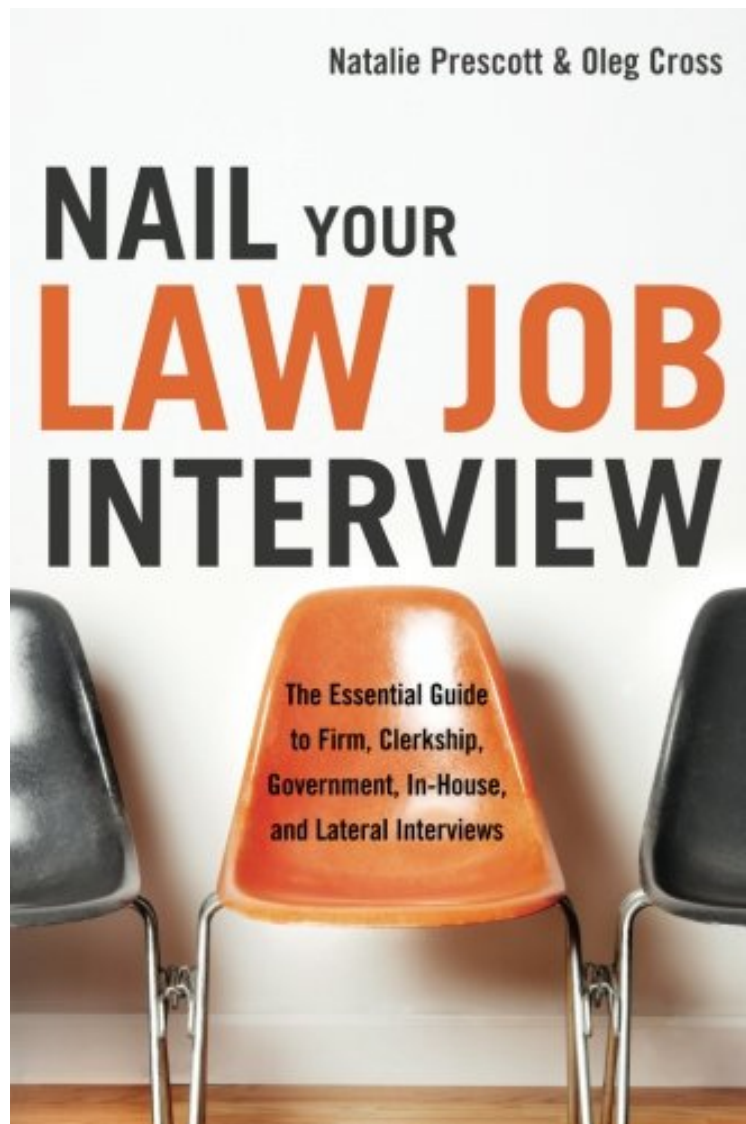

I was looking for a book that would give tips specifically for legal job interviews specifically, and there's not a lot out there on this. Yes, a lot of this book was common sense. A lot of it refreshed what I'd been told before. And a lot of it confirmed what I already thought. As another reviewer said, it's nice to have it all in one place. It's also nice to receive confirmation on things I believed about the interview process because as a new attorney, I don't know it all... yet, haha. And maybe it's true that most interviewers won't expect a woman to wear a skirt to an interview anymore, but why risk it? Or at least know when it's a wise time to risk it.  
This book is a great starting point for law students all the way up to experienced attorneys. I've never been a very good interviewer. I picked this up during the second semester of 3L and read it all the way through in about two sittings. While a lot of the suggestions might seem common sense for someone who's been to a lot of legal interviews, some people (like me) just don't get it and need to be told. While I still didn't magically get callbacks for all the jobs I interviewed for, having read this book greatly increased my confidence so that I could focus on things other than my nerves. I ended up getting a clerkship, so I think things worked out pretty well for me.
