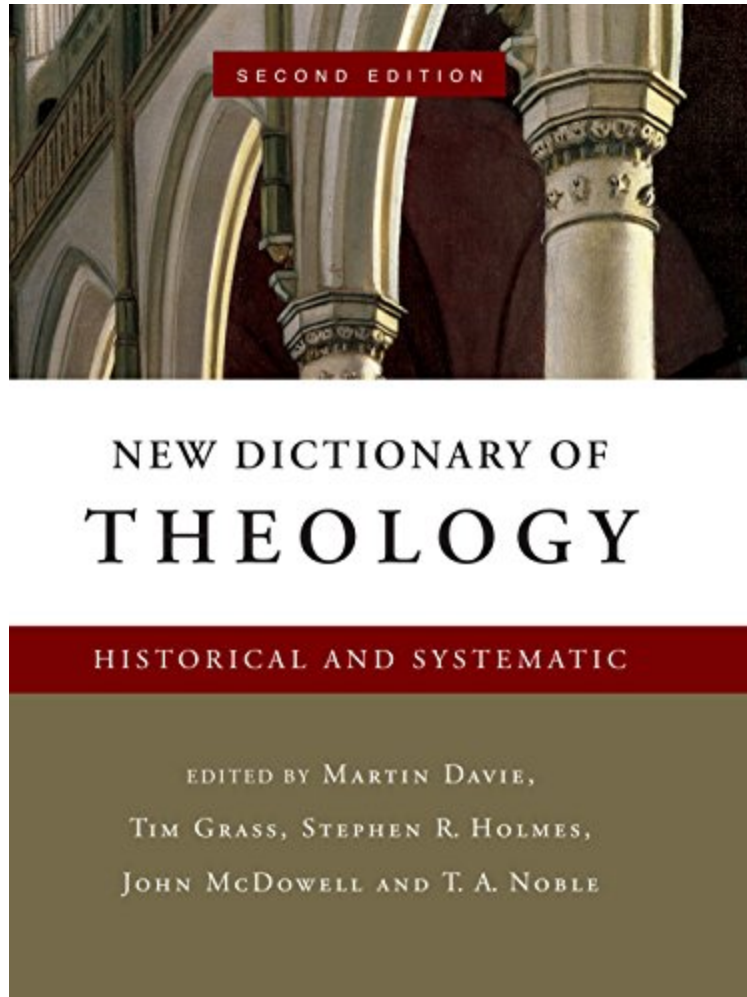

It is essentially a new work in that so many articles were enlarged. The material covered also differs from the first edition because another volume, IVP's New Dictionary of Biblical Theology had already pulled out that material. This volume focuses exclusively on historical and systematic theology in its massive 1000 pages. The list of contributors is impressive. The scholarship is of the highest quality and none of the articles I read seemed to be done in haste. You might make the mistake of forgetting a subject would actually be categorized as biblical theology and search in vain, but if you are looking for historical or systematic theology subjects you likely won't fail to find an entry here. At least I couldn't. Besides the great entries on all the theological concepts, I really enjoyed the biographical entries on the great theologians. They even had an entry for Charles Spurgeon! They purposely included articles on global theology and theological trends of our day. The book is attractive and a joy to peruse. It will serve as an outstanding reference for many years.
