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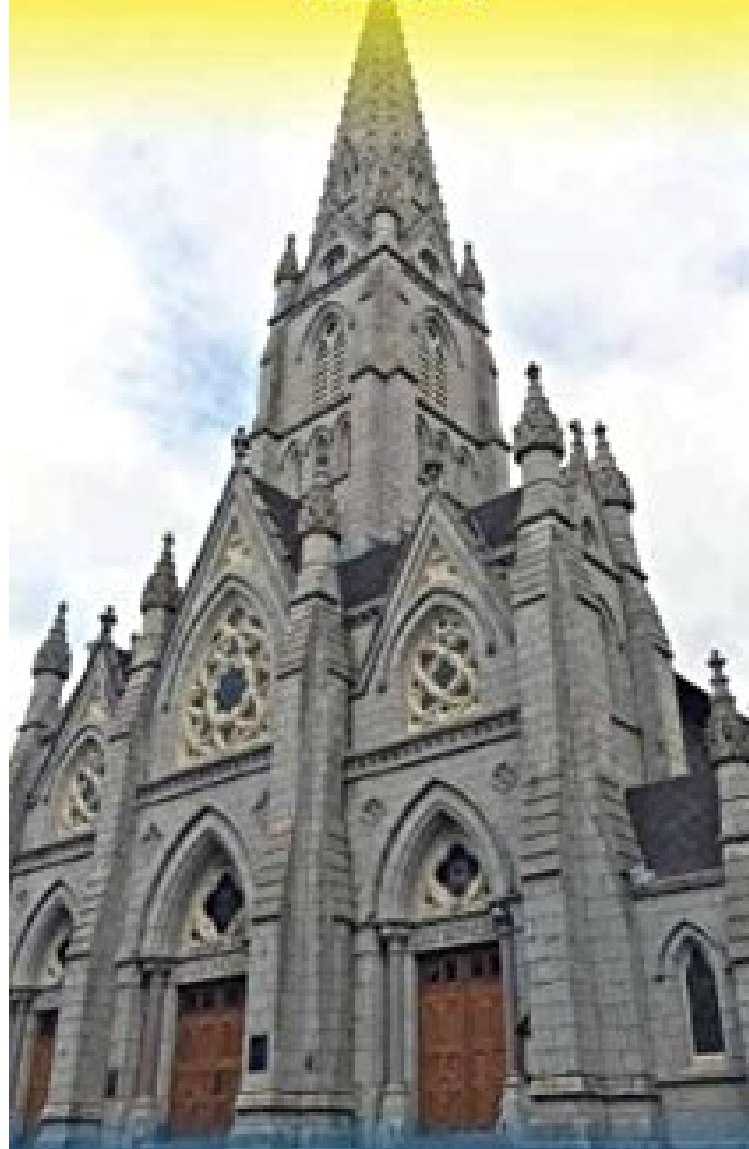

The errors were those of omission, as well as commission. There were many many spelling errors, some of them sufficient that you question if you are looking at the right place. I found at least one town (a significant one, too) that was simply not identified on the map, as though it did not exist at all. Many of the points of interest are mislocated (but it's only by a half inch or inch!). The color/weight of the roads does not consistently correlate to the quality of the road; i.e., you take a road that is paved and halfway through, it turns to unpaved, but they all look the same on this so-called map.
