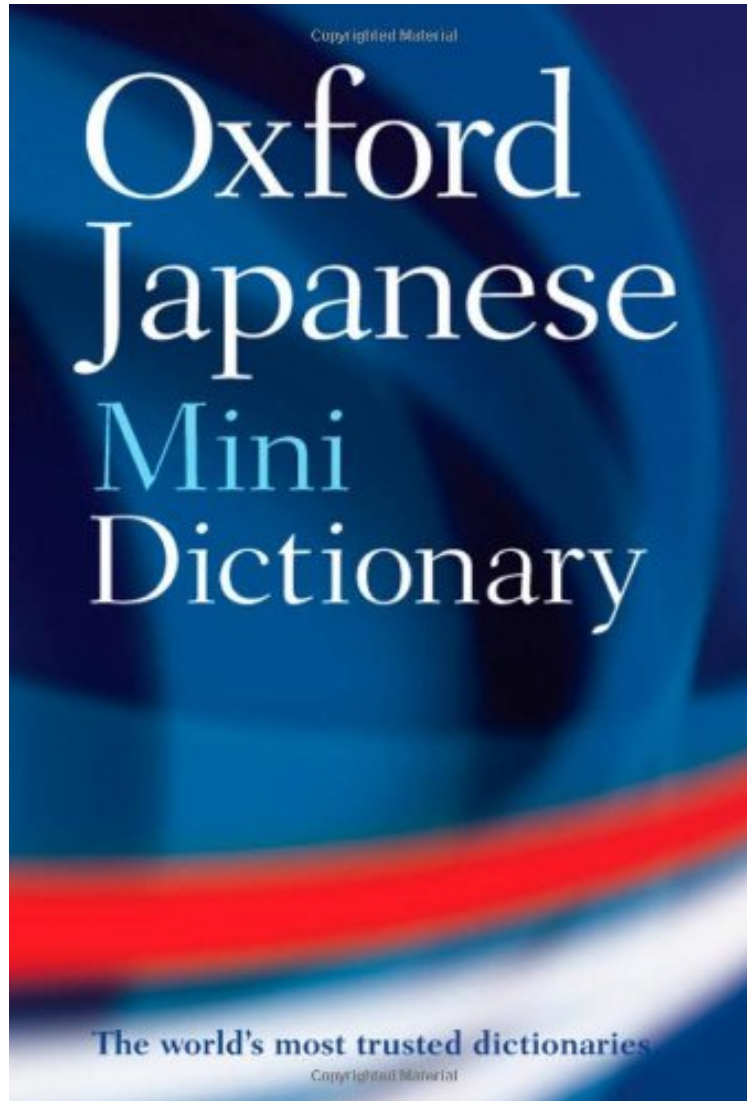

.inside the dictionary it has a section that teaches things like 1. how to say foods 2. very basic phrases 3. japanese particles 4.how to say and write numbers 5. saying dates month and the year and etc etcas well has a table for verbs that is pretty informativethough be warned you may need a magnifying glass if you need to write down how to write a word with a kanji as due to the text being averagely small the complexity of the kanji might make it hard for some people to make out what it is . so if it feels like something that would bother you id also try to find a book separate for kanjii cant find anything to really complain about. i say its an essential!, specially if you want something portable enough to fit in a jacket pocket. its helped me out alot and i would 100% recommended1 of 1 people found the following review helpful.
