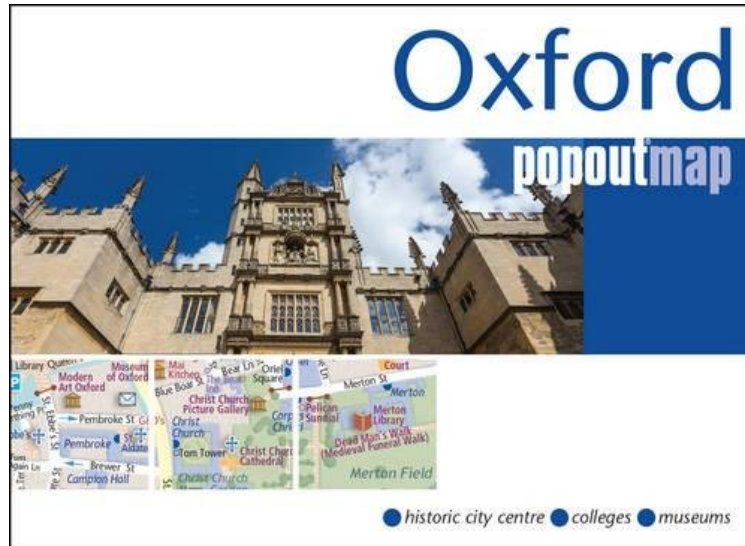

An easy to read map nicely showing all the prime tourist highlights, view points, parks, etc. Its very legible considering how much needs to be crammed into a small space. The outer cover is fairly durable laminated cardstock that will slip into a pocket easily. As some have noted the map that pops out is a bit delicate and wont take rough handling. Id give it a 5 star review except for the fact that the scale is presented as a ratio (1:11,000) rather than a linear scale in miles or kilometers. It's small By Art It's small but unfolds automatically in a second and has the "popular places" marked. These names and graphics obscure some of the street details so you might need another map to find some lesser known places like Oxford Fish Shop (if you go to Oxford don't miss that, it's on Iffley Rd). As a guide, by googling Weston library to New Theatre, I estimate the scale of the map is 7.5 inches =1 mile or about 25 mins walking. 7.5 inches is about the height of the map, it's also about 7.5 inches wide if you count from the Oxford rail station to Addison's Walk. 0 of 0 people found the following review helpful.
