It allows you to look up Arabic words alphabetically, as you would using Al-Mawrid: A Modern Arabic-English Dictionary but also refers you to the three consonant stem to which each word corresponds. In fact, this book provides the equivalent of one to several paragraphs outlining the variants of each three consonant stem. In this way it sort of bridges the gap between a dictionary like Arabic-English Dictionary: The Hans Wehr Dictionary of Modern Written Arabic in which the words are organized by the three consonant stem and a strictly alphabetical dictionary such as Al-Mawrid.1 of 1 people found the following review helpful. Best Single Volume: This book is the best single volume dictionary available on Qur'anic Arabic outside of the respected and popular E.W. Lane's "Arabic-English Lexicon," which comprises several volumes. Another book, different but to a extent complementary, is Hanna E. Kassis "A Concordance of the Qur'an." The latter of course, is an English-based volume, requiring no knowledge of Arabic, but it does provide arabic roots for all English-based words, traced to various Qur'anic translations. The prime difference between Mannan's dictionary and Kassis' concordance is that the former requires elementary knowledge of the Arabic alphabet, while the latter does not! Both are equally accessible to the layman. Ease of Use: Mannan's dictionary follows the same method of use as any standard English dictionary. It is arranged in Arabic alphabetic order, following the sequence of fathah, kasrah, and dammah, in Index 1 (282 pages). Authoritativeness: finally, this dictionary permits the student/researcher to access the "classical" root meanings of all Arabic words used in the Qur'anic Text due to the fact that its very contents come from the best extant classical Arabic works, including Al-Mufridat, Lisan al-`Arab, and Taj al-`Arus.
