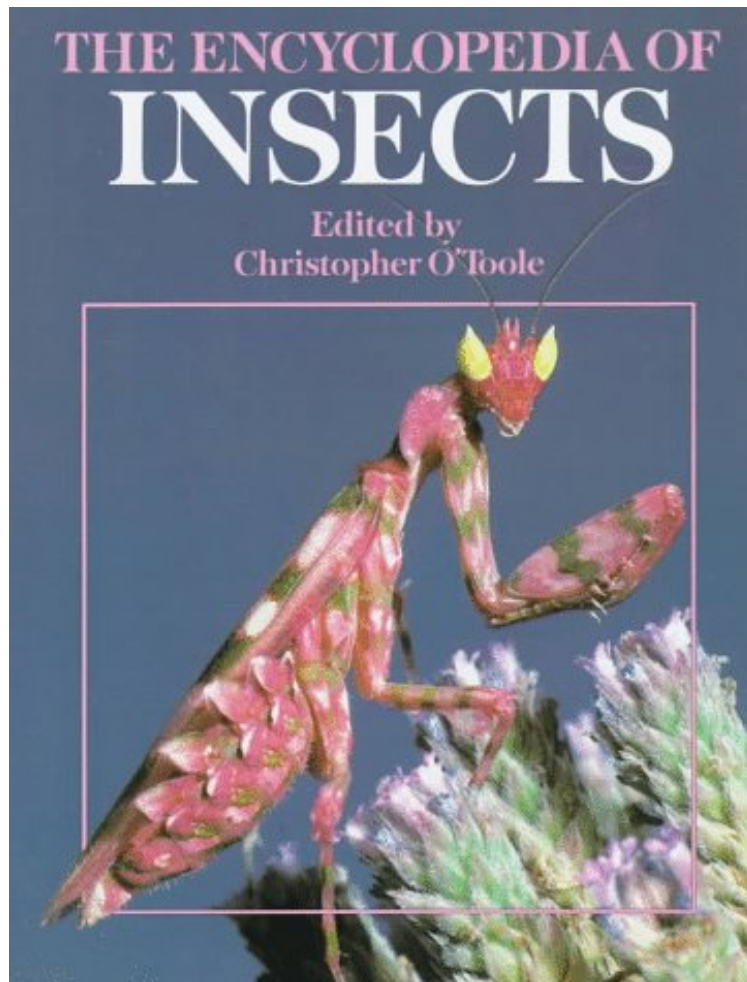

Liberally illustrated by color photographs, drawings, and diagrams, the text includes sidebars on special topics such as insects carrying disease, altruism among social insects, and honeybee dance communication. Despite the presence of a four-page glossary, technical terminology is not always fully explained. Both in degree of difficulty and scope of information, this work is a step above basic field guides.
