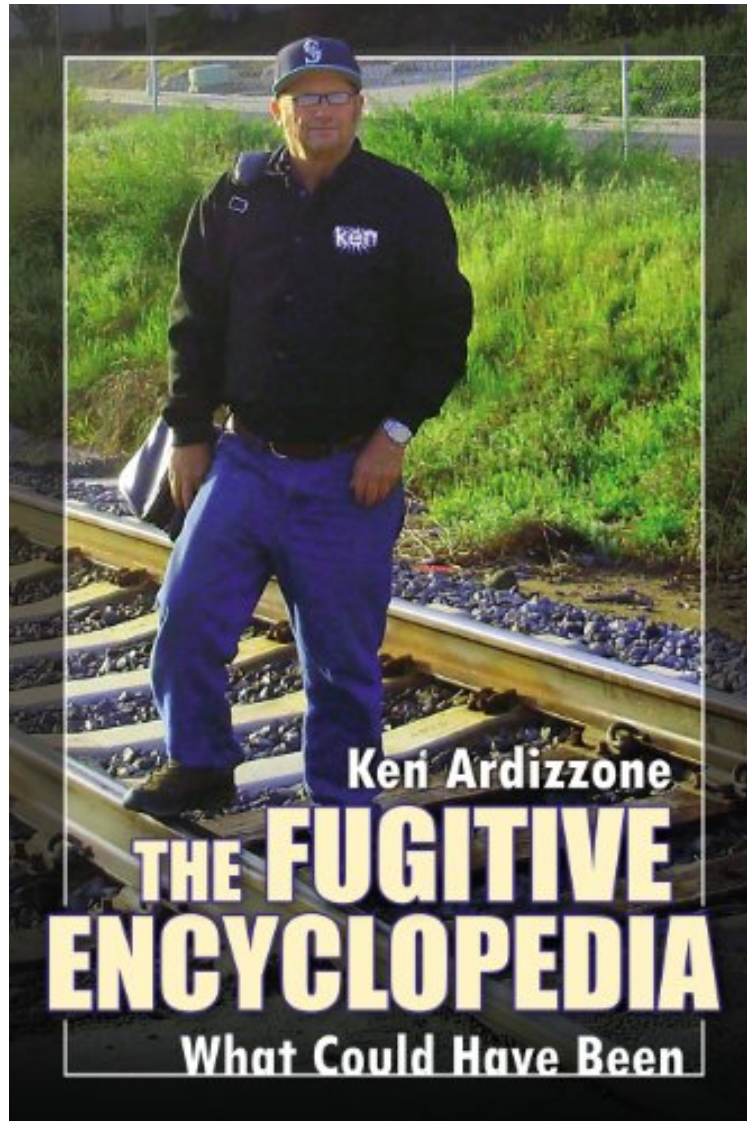

Preface to my new book By Ken Ardizzone Let it be known that I am a huge fan of the hit television show 'The Fugitive' (1963-1967). I have seen every episode and have written a four volume book titled 'The Fugitive Views and Reviews' with two co-authors which provides analysis and critique of all 120 episodes. I recently purchased the four volume DVD set and watched every episode again usually one or two at a time. I decided why not have some fun and write an informal encyclopedia on the series. From the opening story we see Dr. Richard Kimble, a fugitive on the run for his life. Along with his travels he meets a ton of intriguing characters and endures constant tribulations. Since I have already watched every story unfold, how about a quick reference guide detailing all of the accounts, tales, saga, and narrative. Other books on this series focus on the episode guide, back-story of the creator, producers, writers, directors, and actors. This book is intended to be an easy outline for the entire series in general. How many jobs did Kimble perform? Who did he meet while on the run? Where did his plight from the law take him? Interesting enough, Dr. Kimble encountered all kinds of engaging circumstances from A-Z. As a reflection my opening chapter asks a basic fundamental question. Did the pilot episode get off to a proper beginning? Similarly, my final chapter probes into a debatable question. Did the final episodes come to a complete ending? Hopefully, readers will use this book to have a good read. I enjoyed following this series again.
