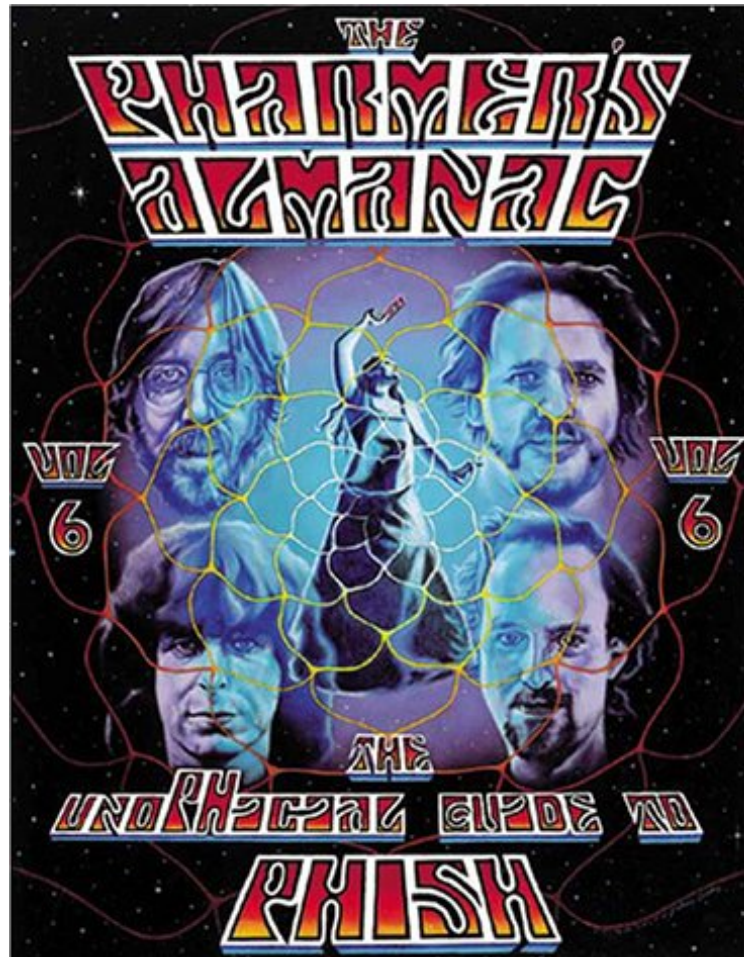

If Phish is a special part of your life as it is mine, then you simply must own this book. It is a wonderful combination of the factual (setlists, stats, song reference tables etc.) and the personal, with brilliant and funny stories written by phans. What sets this book a part from every other Phish book is how it has a little something for everyone. The band history, covering about 30 pages at the front of the book, is more thorough and more entertaining than any

ever written. There's a great piece on Tom Marshall, based on an interview with him, and many rare photos (Wetlands! Amy's Farm!). Then there are some really moving personal stories about Phish show experiences. I've read lots of boring personal Phish stories online that no one but the writer's mother would care about. But these are truly compelling works of literature. I guarantee you that if you are a Phish fan, you will read this book more times over than any you have ever owned. The critics of this book are just plain jealous, that's all. The Pharmers have done it again!

This classic manual to the phenomenon that is Phish continues to grow and improve in this sixth edition, which contains an exhaustively thorough account of the musical group's 17-year career from cult band whose loyal fans followed them from one college gymnasium to another, to the most phenomenal touring machine in music, grossing \$39 million last year alone. The band now has two flavors of Ben and Jerry's ice cream bearing its name, members of the Grateful Dead and Little Feat covering its songs, such legends as Willie Nelson and Los Lobos participating in a Phish tribute album, and a feature film about the band, *Bittersweet Hotel*, in theaters across the country all without a platinum album. Celebrating the band and an ever-growing fan base that encourages change and despises mainstream acceptance, this book features every song ever performed live and the stories behind it, setlists and reviews for every show since 1983, and a readers survey. Also included are venues and set times, folklore, special guests, Phish-inspired bands, a hometown tour of Vermont, and interviews with Phish-related musicians, friends, and family. Intimate stories from the band and photos and stories from fans cap off this tribute to the offbeat band from Vermont.
