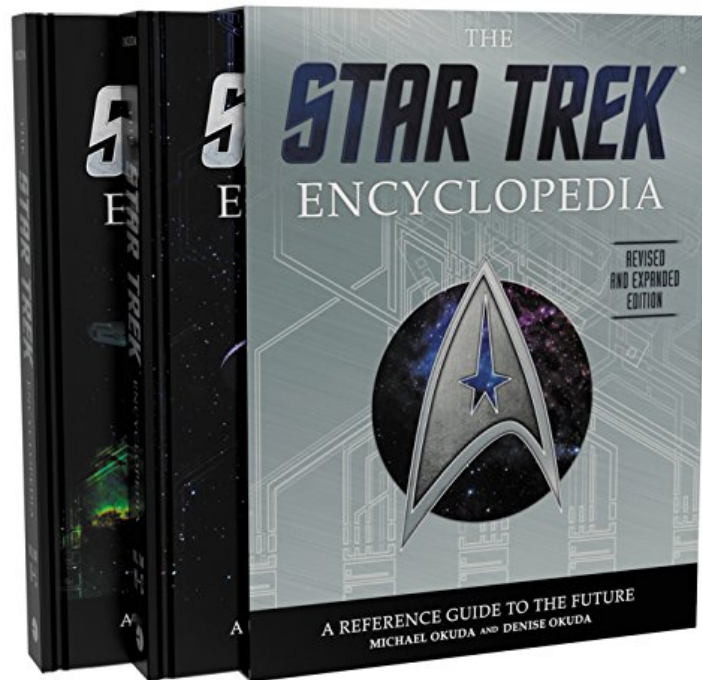

Biblographic information on characters is very useful and informative. Every time I pick it up I learn something new (or something I

have always wondered about, but didn't quite know where to look). There should be a sub section on Trek movies. Some of the writing is a bit concise, but then this is a massive undertaking.
