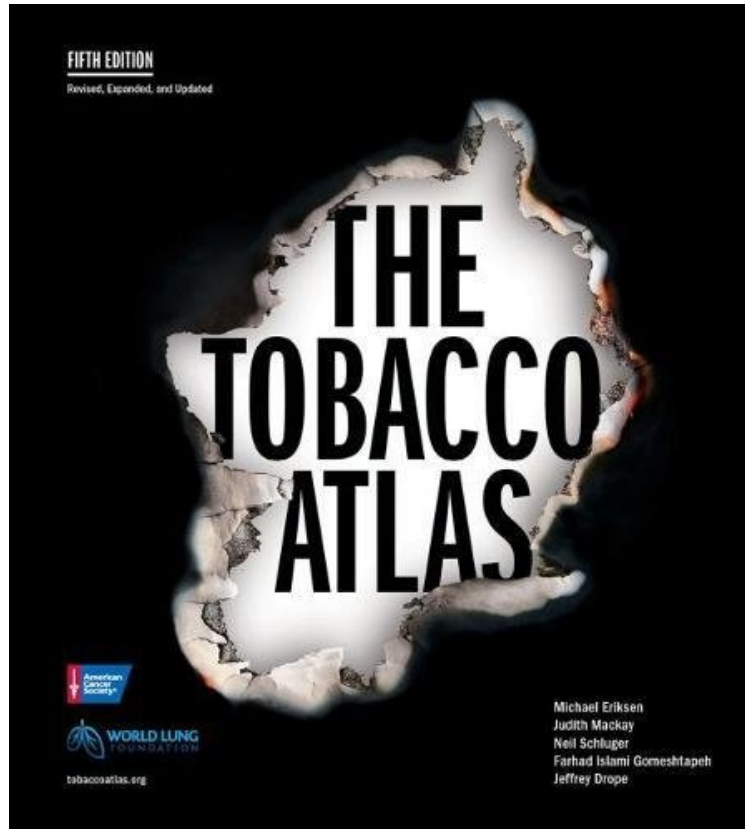

First published in 2002, this updated work uses maps, charts, and graphs to present data from the World Health Organizations working groups that deal with tobacco. Statistics and information on tobaccos harmful effects, the types of tobacco products used, tobacco production, tobacco use, the influence of the tobacco industry, and the success of health-education projects are all included. A glossary, a history of tobacco, and a bibliography round out the volume.
