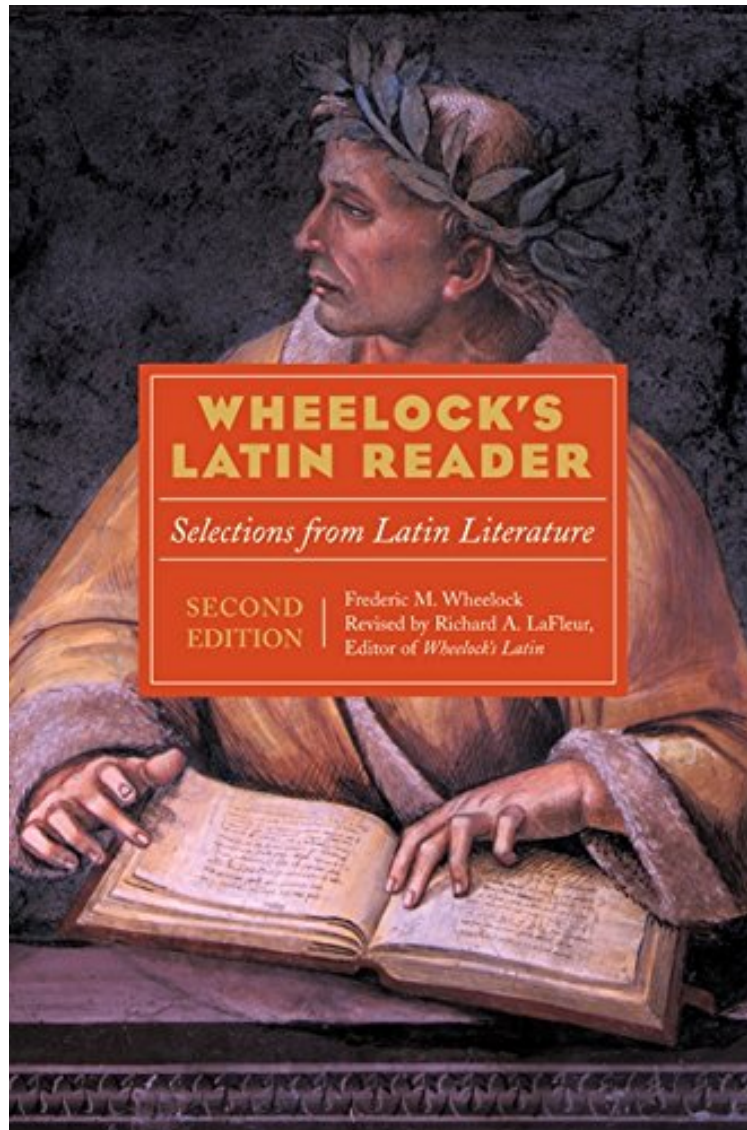

The Kindle (and e-pub) format however is very badly edited and loses the line-numbering and opposite page annotations that make the print version so convenient and effective.
