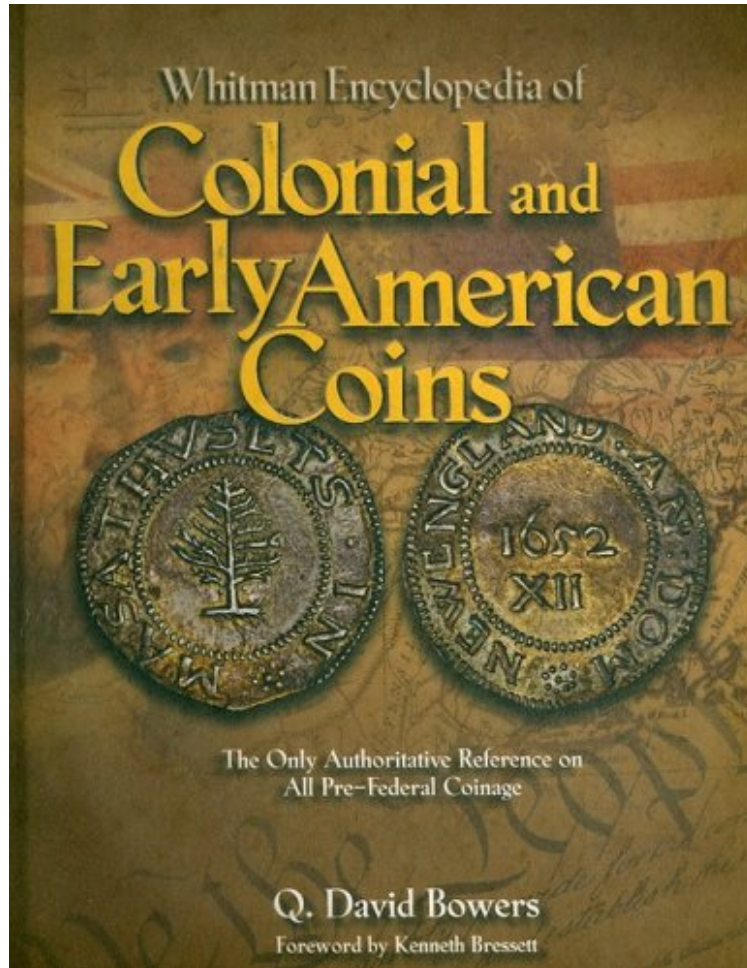

TO MY POINT: Having no prior experience in this area of numismatics, acquiring such coins, without an idea of type, value, rarity or mintage could have turned into a dangerous and expensive venture. Therefore I needed help. This book was the answer!!!! Not only does Mr. Bowers list ALL colonials and give a round about value, he also lists rarity and gives estimated numbers known; for each variety of each coin!! This really helped me get a better grasp of the coins I was looking at. Also, with the MANY varieties of colonials, he offers a system of matching the obverse and reverse of all coins, with great quality color pictures and then lists the "type" of variety within that series it may be. Although I was

slightly confused at first, after the first few days of doing this, I had it down! Also, as a bonus, the chapters on the history behind colonials; from the ins and outs of minting to those involved in starting coinage in this country and much more, had not only added to my intrigue but also my knowledge!! Lastly, one valuable tip. Mr. Bowers states that money values listed are very approximate and can be quite different now, versus when the book was published (which I believe was 2008.) I have found that going on major auction sites, (Heritage, Stacks Bowers) to check current prices realized for the colonials I have an interest in, has helped tremendously to narrow that gap.
