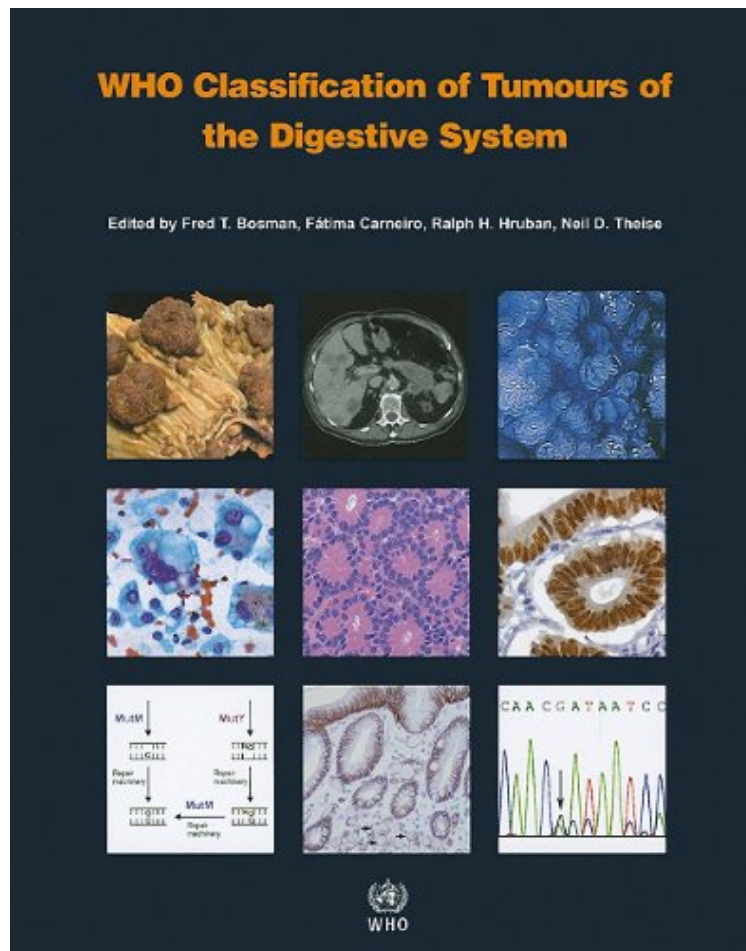


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## WHO Classification of Tumours of the Digestive System (IARC WHO Classification of Tumours)
