There are several assignments that ask you to translate from English into German. While this isn't a good choice for someone brand new to the language it is a solid reference textbook to help those who are familiar with German expand their skills. It gives opportunities for

you to dialogue with other classmates by offering some suggestions of topics. It also provides you with a good background in grammar, tenses, etc., in a simple manner which is sometimes missing in other texts. If you can find a copy with the CD you will have an additional benefit to help with pronunciation.
