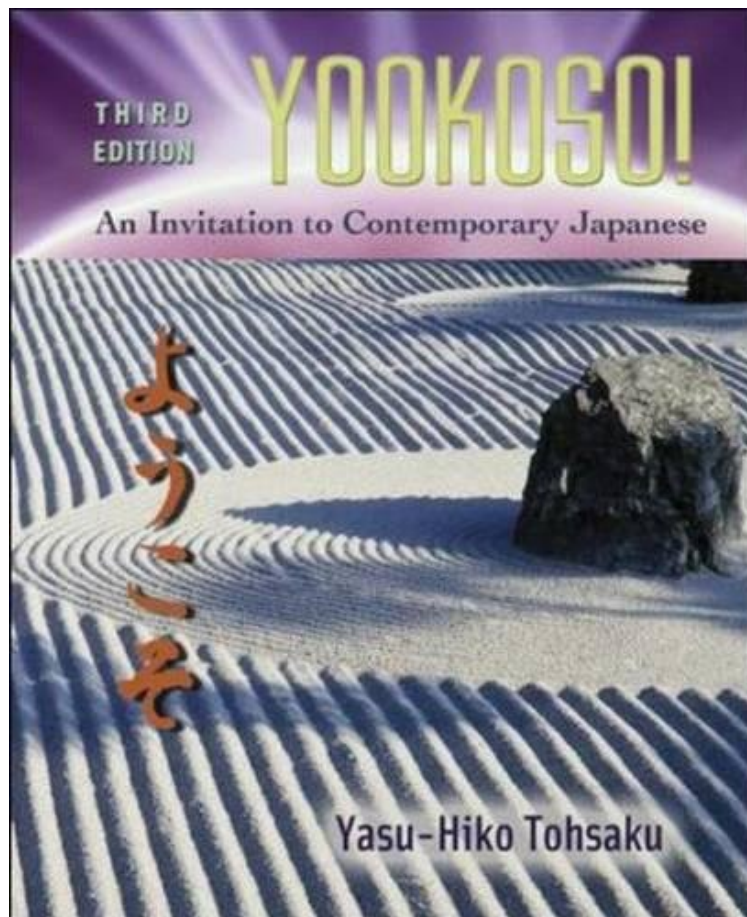

I can't compare it to other beginner books, but do be aware that this series is considered one of the best three, at least academically.Also, just a general note of Yookoso! series overall - I think its a generally fine book, but the later books (level 3 and up) rapidly pile on the kanji, and its hard to remember with so many thrown at you. I also think the series fails at reinforcing old grammars and vocab as they are sometimes rarely brought up again after their introduced

The pages and print are of amazing quality, and it's a hardcover book. I have been able to successfully take notes in the book in pencil, and not smudge or dull the print when I erase it. This is obviously beneficial to those who keep their books for later revision, and to those who are looking to resell them in the future. Also, this is one of the easiest language learning books I have used. There are many pictures to show actions, or for relation to time or place. Also, this book very quickly but carefully brings you to fluently read Hiragana and Katakana. My instructor also mentioned, "This Yookoso! text book is used for Japanese 'A' and 'B' (1st year, 2nd year)." So this book will last you TWO CLASSES, not just one. If you would like an amazing dictionary selection to go along with your text and workbook, I recommend "Kudansha's Furigana Japanese Dictionary". It will also last you many years and is of great quality.

By Shelby If you are just getting started learning Japanese, you WILL NEED supplementary material to go along with the textbook and workbook! Unless you are taking a class that REQUIRES this particular book, do yourself a favor and find something else. The book has a confusing set-up, and does NOT provide enough background information for a beginner to make sense of the activities. There will be sections instructing you to "learn this Kanji!" that do not give the definitions of what those kanji mean, or how they are pronounced, or any other information. Unless you already know a fair bit of the language and are just refreshing, this book will probably make little to no sense to you.

Yookoso! An Invitation to Contemporary Japanese is the first volume of a two-volume series for beginning Japanese courses. Based on modern principles of second-language acquisition, it was the first beginning Japanese text to integrate the teaching of all four language skills (listening, speaking, reading, and writing) and offer a full complement of ancillary materials. In this text, grammar is treated as a tool for developing the ability to communicate in Japanese, rather than as a focal point. The rich illustration program--including photographs, line drawings, and realia--provides an attractive context for language learning.
